5 Quick Facts on Remembrance Day

- The first Remembrance Day observed in Canada was on November 11th, 1931.
- It was originally called "Armistice Day" to commemorate the armistice agreement that ended the First World War on Monday, November 11th, 1918 at 11 a.m. on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month.
- From 1921 to 1930, Armistice Day was held on the Monday of the week in which November 11th fell.

- The poppy is, of course, the symbol of Remembrance Day. Replica poppies are sold by the Royal Canadian Legion to provide financial assistance to our Veterans.
- The annual Poppy Campaign begins on the last Friday in October and continues through to November 11th. The Legion suggests that the poppy be worn on the left lapel of a garment and as close to the heart as possible.
